What Shall We Do While We're Waiting?

While the Pastor Nominating Committee continues the search for our next pastor the rest of the congregation has work it can do. Fred Rogers, beloved children's television host and Presbyterian minister had a song he sang called, "*What Shall We Do While We're Waiting?*" And our assignment is no more complicated than that. The congregation at large has a lot of things we can do while the nominating committee does their work. What shall we do? We can do the work Jesus sent us out to do.

It's no more complicated than what's found in scripture in Jesus' ministry. Julie Adkins even preached a sermon that suits this topic just before she left for vacation on July 2nd.

She used the story of Abraham greeting the stranger in the desert and referred us to Jesus' teachings: that "To welcome the stranger is to welcome Jesus, is to welcome God. To minister to the stranger is to care for Jesus, is to receive the reward of God."

What do we do while we wait for our next pastor? We go ahead and do what Jesus told us to do every other time of our lives—we go ahead and live our lives the way Jesus wants us to live, we go ahead a do ministry, welcome the stranger, care for the orphan.

There are some opportunities available right here in Winnsboro, sitting right here on our doorstep.

The Northeast Texas Child Advocacy Center serves abused children over the whole area of Northeast Texas yet it's only a couple of miles down highway 37 from us. They would welcome out help, financial or physical. Our youth already support them through the Noisy Offering. Maybe we could enlarge our involvement with their ministry. And the most obvious opportunity is sitting almost directly across the street from us. Memorial Middle School releases children every afternoon who walk or ride their bike right past our building. We are in the perfect position to provide an afternoon snack, a safe space for homework and adult supervision. Our parking lot has a basketball court. We have a playground. The Reid Building has a kitchen and three TV sets. And when I say "our" I really mean "God's" parking lot, God's playground and God's kitchen.

In case you missed Julie's sermon let me repeat her closing paragraph here:

"What risks have you not taken, that you perhaps should get ready to take? What rewards have you been missing out on? What risks are **we**, together, perhaps being asked to undertake? Who else is "out there" that needs to be welcomes, needs a cup of water, needs our hospitality? Where is Jesus still waiting for us to recognize him, dressed as a stranger? And if we don't do it, who will?"

The question is not "What shall we do while we're waiting?" The question is "Why are we waiting?"

KEEPING FAITH-----Hebrews 10: 32 - 11: 6

It's tempting to think of faith as a kind of magic formula. If you muster up enough of it, you'll get rich, stay healthy, and live a contented life with automatic answers to all your prayers. But life does not work according to such neat formulas. As proof, the author of Hebrews presents a stirring reminder of what constitutes "true faith" by reviewing the lives of some Old Testament giants of faith (Heb. 11).

"Without faith," the author says bluntly, "it's impossible to please God" (Heb. 6). In describing faith he uses the word, *persevered* (v. 7). As a result of their faith, some heroes triumphed: They routed armies, escaped the sword, survived lions. But others met less happy ends: They were flogged, stoned, sawed in two. The chapter concludes, "These were all commended for their faith, yet none of them received what had been promised" (v.39).

The picture of faith that emerges does not fit into an easy formula. Sometimes it leads to victory and triumph. Sometimes it requires a gritty determination to "hang on at any cost." Of such people, "God is not ashamed to be called their God, for He has prepared a city for them" (v. 16).

What our faith rests on is the belief that God is in ultimate control and will indeed keep His promises--whether that happens in this life or the next.

Our greatest comfort in *sorrow* is to know that *God is in control*. Phillip Yancey/Taken from, OUR DAILY BREAD, JULY '16.



We also meet each month for fellowship, a short business meeting, and Bible Study.
