# Jane's Journey

A few people have asked me for a copy of the story I told in my sermon a few weeks ago. Here it is:

Dick Kueser was a big man. He was tall and broad and big. He had a chipped tooth and wore a black cowboy hat when he drove his 18-wheeler rig. At 2 a.m. on a deserted road he looked scary to a young woman whose car was broken down on the side of the road. But she didn't have much choice when he pulled over to ask her what was the problem. She told him she thought her car was out of gas. She thought if she could get to

a phone she could call her father and he could come help her. (Obviously, this is an old story from days before cell phones were invented.) Dick was thinking of his own daughter who was about the same age and urged her to get in his truck for a ride to the gas station just up the road. He could tell she was apprehensive. He knew his appearance probably scared her to death.

On the ride to the gas station Dick kept up a light banter about his daughter in college but his passenger was clearly uncomfortable, hugging the door stiffly. Once at the gas station she hopped out of the truck and started toward the pay phone only to stop half-way, her shoulders sagged in defeat. "What's wrong?" Dick called out. "I left my purse back at the car. I don't have money for the phone." (I told you this was before cell phones.) Dick got out of the truck and reached in his pocket, pulling the entire contents of his pocket up in his massive hand and held everything out for the girl to pick. "Here, get you a quarter," he instructed. She took a quarter, went inside, made the phone call and came back to the truck.

Dick told me that after she talked to her father everything changed. She was relaxed and talkative as they waited. She told him about school and he talked about his own daughter. He father eventually arrived and she introduced them and prepared to get in his car to leave. But Dick wasn't ready to part, "Before you go I want to ask you a question. You were obviously wary of me until you talked to you father. But after you made your phone call you were so much more relaxed. I just want to know what did your Dad say to you on the phone?"

"Oh, no—if wasn't anything he said to me. It was you. When you held out your hand to me to give me a quarter for the phone I saw all the things in your pocket and I saw that you carry a pocket cross. That's when I knew you are a Christian and I knew I would be safe."

Now here's the best part of the story....the part I didn't tell you. Dick Kueser had a stutter. He wasn't an eloquent speaker. Yet he preached a sermon that day without saying a word. He merely held out his hand to offer a quarter for the phone.
