Jane's Journey



Easter is still fresh in our minds. While our inclination might be to think, "whew, that's over. Now I can rest." To the contrary, we have just begun.

Easter gives us a chance to reset our souls; to begin again; this time maybe I can get it right. Maybe this time I will understand what it is Jesus wants me to do.

And, of all the things Jesus said and did, he was very clear on his last night with his disciples. "A new commandment I give to you that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another." John 13: 34 (He also said it again in John 15:12 in case they hadn't heard him the first time.)

Earlier that same night he had also told his disciples that they should wash each other's feet as he had done for them.

For a few years now I have been searching for the modern-day equivalent of this ancient ritual. Back in ancient days the roads were unpaved, travel was by foot. A traveler visiting a house would arrive with dirty and tired feet. It was an accepted ritual for the master of the house to have a servant wash the feet of a visitor. This was an intimate and humble task but also an ordinary everyday task.

Today this would make people uncomfortable. I watched Facebook the week before Easter as various pastors tried suggesting it. The answers all came back that it would make people uncomfortable. So folks set upon trying to find the modern day equivalent of fulfilling Jesus' commandment to humble ourselves and perform a needed task for weary travelers.

Someone sent me a link to the First United Methodist Church in Denton, Texas. They have a ministry to provide new shoes to the migrants who have walked so far to reach the US border. Politics aside, these are weary travelers with tired and dusty feet. Jesus is asking us to humble ourselves before them and take care of their feet. The Denton church isn't asking us to wash naked feet. However, they are giving us a chance to help people with tired feet and worn out shoes.

Jesus' command to wash feet doesn't always have to be about feet, though. I think he would be OK with nursing home visits or buying school supplies for kids. If we humble ourselves in love I think that fits the bill.

All Jesus said was "Love one another." We get to decide how to do that.
