Jane's Journey

I want to catch our friends in Winnsboro up on wonderful things our brother Armel Crocker is doing. This week he is going back to school. He will be attending Perkins School of Theology on the SMU campus near where he lives in Dallas. He'll take a class in Old Testament two days a week and then another class in Christian Theology the other two days. Down the road he'll decide if this ends up as a path to ordination or just education for fun. On

Sundays, he preaches somewhere each week. He is on two of the most active committees of Grace Presbytery: the Committee on Ministry and the Social Justice Task Force.

The other way Armel shared his talent was at a fantastic camp Gilmont hosted at the end of their summer. I wrote about it on my blog if you want the whole scoop: https://janeels.blogspot.com

You should be able to just click on that link or type it into your browser. Gilmont hosted the first ever faith-based camp for LGBT kids in the nation. It was so newsworthy that Presbyterians Today covered it in their magazine, as did Presbyterian Mission. I have always loved Gilmont's heart for hosting camps for kids who need a place to go and just relax and "be themselves." That's why I've volunteered in the kitchen at the Gluten-Free camp for the past few years. Kids should not have to worry about what they are going to eat at camp. And kids shouldn't have to worry about peer pressure at camp if they are gay or transgender. Kids should be able to just have fun at camp. And Gilmont keeps making it easier for kids to do that.

He and I both spent the week at the camp and were the oldest staff members there. And since we weren't exactly going to coach volleyball they gave us the titles of "Wise Elders." I worked in the kitchen and made myself in charge of hugs. To my astonishment, I had three little girls who told me their own grandmothers would not hug them after they came out of the closet as gay. Armel talked to the kids about what it was like to live through the AIDS crisis in San Francisco in the 1980's.

God is revealing our vocations to us. As Buechner said, "Where our deep gladness and the world's deep hunger meet, we hear a further call."
