Jane's Journey

One of the churches I serve is small enough that if enough people miss church they are in danger of going empty. Last week we had a couple of people in the hospital and a whole family knew they were going to miss church for a special project so the clerk of the session called me to update me and see if we needed to cancel worship.

Every year the Deport Ministerial Alliance buys clothes and toys for the needy of their town for Christmas and a couple from our church head up the group who goes to buy these gifts. They always take their grown daughter and

college-aged daughter. Together this family comprise about half of the church attendance. But buying the Christmas gifts is a whole family project for them. And the best day to shop is Sunday. I'm not sure but the store may either close or let them in early. So it was with some apology that Laura called to explain why they would miss church Sunday.

I told her no apology was necessary and, in fact, the more I thought about it, the more convinced I was that this was a perfect example of our sermon that Sunday.

Luke 18:9-14 is the Parable of the Tax Collector humbling himself and the Pharisee exalting himself with Jesus saying that all who exalt themselves will be humbled and those who humble themselves will be exalted.

It reminded me of the people who go to places like hurricane disaster zones and help with the recovery. People like Chef Jose Andres who made 200,000 meals in the first week after Ian. Or our own Presbyterian Disaster Assistance who stayed for seven years after Katrina to help New Orleans.

Sometimes the congregation of a church leaves the building and preaches the sermon instead of the preacher. And that's what Deport did on October 23. No, they didn't beat their chests and exclaim, "Lord, be merciful to me, a sinner!" but they did live out their day in a spirit of humility. They recognized that there are people out there who need their love and it doesn't matter whether they know these people or if the people are "worthy" or not. God is the judge of these things. God is the only one who can exalt us. All we can do is recognize the Grace God offers us and then live life a life of gratitude in response.

Living in gratitude and humility is not a meek or a weak life. It's actually a courageous one. Going to buying Christmas gifts for the kids of the town instead of going to church might look like skipping church to some. I call it BEING church.

Plus, without all those grownups, the only family left was the one with five small children. We met anyway-- and sat around the piano while their mother played the piano, eating popcorn and singing songs. I call it win-win.
