Easter will be April 9th this year. We know that Jesus was arrested the night of the Passover meal so that's how we know to tie the date to the full moon and the equinox because that's

how the Jews time their Passover. So, I guess in that respect our timing of Easter is fairly correct.

I'm taking a class online in Sacred Time. We started out with the hours of the day, then the week, and the next week we studied the monthly times. This week we will discuss the annual times. Each week we will deal with a long space of time until the last page of the last chapter when we get to eternity.

The author of the book we're using in the class is Christine Valters Paintner. Here is the gem of wisdom she closes the book with: "Eternity is not something that happens after we die; eternity also exists here in all the glorious spaces where we lose track of time because our hearts are so full of wonder and delight. God is a God of circles and rhythms, inviting us always to fall fully into this moment."

This means that God has been with us during every moment of the Lenten season and will be with us as we sit around the table to remember Jesus' Last Supper with his friends on Maundy Thursday. And God will be with us with the first glorious note on the organ on Easter morning. God was with us as children as we ran through the grass as children excitedly gathering Easter eggs. And God will be with us as we draw our last mortal breath and transition to a life that does not require breathing or walking or standing in line at the grocery store.

We live within eternity right now. We live with God right now.
