# Jane's Journey

I never named this column "Jane's Journey." Someone else did. When I started writing a column for the church newsletter for the church I attended in Garland back in the 1980's someone on the staff of the church named the column—mostly I think because of the two J's. But over the years I've come to appreciate what it means.

The journey through life can be about our final destination of life where we hope to end up eternally with God, AKA heaven; but so much of life is

also the journey of living our life while we are here in our mortal lives. And, as "mortal, material human with skin" we usually concentrate on this life we are living now. After all, it's the only life we know. But we know this life will come to an end eventually and the eternal life, the one we are aiming for—the one spent with God forever—will begin.

I once visited a huge church that had retrofitted their bathrooms with a few shower stalls so they could offer housing for overnight guests such as the mission trip I was part of. They had a big shower stall for handicapped use that was designed for wheelchair use. Instead of a steep curb to keep the water inside the shower stall there was a smooth slope to transition from the dry area into the wet area. The transition was so smooth that the only thing separating the two was the shower curtain. You could roll a wheelchair right into the shower.

When I saw this I wondered is this might be what the ideal transition into heaven might be like. I decided that day that I would like to live my life so spiritually that when my time came to leave the mortal life and transition into my immortal life the transition might be as smooth as rolling into that shower stall.

That would make for a smooth transition. And it would make for a spiritual journey. I haven't gotten there yet. But it's my goal. I sure hope I have plenty of time left for practice. For now, I am trying to speak less and listen more. And be more in tune to what God has to say to me. Hopefully, when it is time for me to act then it will be something God wants me to do and not my own idea.

Maybe one day, if all goes well, I will look around and notice I'm in heaven and won't remember how I got there.
