Jane's Journey

Pentecost is coming and we will learn how the Holy Spirit moved to enable a bumbling bunch of disciples to become the dynamic apostles who built the ministry of Christ into a movement that became worldwide. How did they do this? Person by person.

A few years ago there was some sort of environmental emergency near Autumn Winds Senior Living Center that caused them to evacuate the center to a couple of the big churches here in town. Sandy called me to say they might need some help so I went to one of the places they had

sent residents. On the way out the door I changed into the red t-shirt our church had printed to wear on Pentecost. I wanted to represent our congregation and be visible. I spent some time making sure that the four members of our church were connected with their family. All of our members living at Autumn Winds went to stay with their children for the night. Gradually, the evacuation center began emptying out but there were a few residents who either had no family or their family lived out of town. And those folks were waiting for a van to take them to a hotel for the night.

I decided to stay because the people who were left needed someone to visit with them. Eventually one woman came up to me and asked if I was from a church. I could tell she had seen my shirt and already knew the answer. We started talking and she told me she was waiting for the van to take her to the hotel. By wearing our church's t-shirt, I represented not only Christ but church family to people who had none. Linda and I have been friends ever since.

I'm sure most members of our church have people in their lives to whom we bring Christ when those people have no one else. I know I'm not the only one. And wearing a t-shirt isn't the only way. But it is a quick way to introduce ourselves. Just like yard signs and Facebook, we have many ways to tell people what is "inside" our building for people to know without actually walking inside.

And maybe the goal isn't so much getting people to come inside and worship with us (though that would be nice); maybe the goal would be to spread the love of Christ to everyone. To let people know that God loves them no matter who they are, no matter how they dress, what they look like, who they love, or how they vote.
