# Jane's Journey

First, I would like to thank everyone for all their prayers for Beaven's heart procedure. He came through with flying colors. The doctor didn't want him to drive for a while and that's why he wasn't in church. But he feels great.

I had a really busy day the other day with my various flocks. When I called for intercessory prayer during worship, the list just seemed really busy at both Paris and Deport. One of the Deport folks was in a motorcycle accident in Arkansas and is having to stay there for a while. Then, when I got home I got word that my cousin was in the hospital in Dallas.

It's just hard to minister to people when you are in one place and they are in another city. One church veteran reminded me that I can reach out to the Arkansas presbytery to find pastoral support for the couple in the hospital there. Right now they are so exhausted (and new to the ways of the church) that this would feel uncomfortable to them so they took a rain check on that option for the time being.

I found myself wondering how on earth can I minister to people "by remote control"?

Prayer.

It's such an obvious and simple answer that it seems almost too easy. Almost like it's not doing "enough." Yet, sometimes it's our only option. When the need is too overwhelming or too complicated, too messy, too personal, too everything. When we need to talk to the Creator of us all, who is the only one who could possibly understand the situation—prayer is the best option. When we need the One who can move mountains and do miracles—prayer is the only option. When humans can't solve a problem—prayer is the only option.

And most times prayer is the best option. Because God will always know the best solution to any situation. God really is better at this than we are.

Prayer should be our first, second and all in between options.
