# **Jane's Journey**

About a month ago the presbytery sent me to a conference at the University of the Ozarks in Clarksville, Arkansas called simply "Rural Ideas." It wasn't hard to talk me into going since Emily had gone to college there and I was curious to see the campus again. I was joined by several colleagues from Grace Presbytery I already knew and while we were there, we were surrounded by a few hundred

other Presbyterians as well as Methodists and a few Baptists. But the greatest bonus was getting to spend a lot of mealtimes just talking with fellow clergy. Back home the presbytery asked me to report on the top ten things I learned. Here they are:

The Top Ten Things I Learned at the Rural Ideas Conference

- 1. You don't have to be surrounded by cows and chickens to be a rural church. Any small town can be rural.
- 2. The average congregation size in the US is 50 members, sometimes 30.
- 3. Most big cities have an anchor institution which provides the "hub" of activity, usually a university or a corporation, while in a rural area this is usually a church.
- 4. Assuming bigger is better is wrong. Jesus said that whenever two or more gather in his name he would be with us. All we need is two.
- 5. Don't wait for the cavalry. The calvary is not coming. We are the calvary.
- 6. Older churches are usually tucked into a neighborhood and can perform the function of being a "neighbor": helping kids with homework, loaning books, visiting the elderly singles, etc.
- 7. People don't know what is inside your building unless you tell them. "All Are Welcome" signs are a big help.
- 8. Paved parking lots are an empty canvas waiting for the community to use it. Basketball hoops are great for drawing in young people.
- 9. Listen to your community. It's the church or nobody.
- 10. Take a risk. Be people of Hope
